DA JUDGE, DAVID KALEMKARIAN, was presented with his first PAUL HARRIS by PAUL MASQUELIER. PAUL inadvertently dropped the pin on the floor during the pinning. Fortunately, some very young eyes found the pin on the carpet so PAUL could finish the presentation. The room stood and applauded.

TIM HENSLEIT announced that for \$40 each you too can attend the COGs Spring Fling Mixer Friday May 6th from 6:00 to 9:00 pm at the Birdstone Winery in Madera. President BERNADETTE requested Rotarians to seriously consider this year's District Conference which is much less expensive than in the past (\$50 gets you all in). The meeting at Torino's is dark May 12th to encourage your participation.

LARRY GRANADOS introduced Bart Marks, the founder of the Fire & Ice diamond brand. According to Larry, 'Bart founded the Fire & Ice diamond brand because he truly believed there was a better way to cut a diamond.' He stated that Bart felt in his heart, he knew an exquisitely formed, optically pure diamond crystal desires to be part of the Fire & Ice brand, and believes he can provide it. It has a bigger, brighter and whiter appearance compared to other top rated diamonds. Bart believes choosing beauty over weight is the best of the difficult choices cutters need to make. Bart's education and history in the jewelry business is extensive. He is now the Vice President of Rogers Jewelry Co. of California and CEO of Rogers of NV. He is President of Fire & Ice Diamonds. The diamonds on display were replicas of some very well known naturally occurring stones.

Mr Marks commented on two in particular: The Hope Diamond and its well known but misunderstood 'curse,' and the Grand Mogul diamond that belonged to a Sultan in India who strategically placed it in a palace window so he could see the reflection of the Taj Mahal. He mentioned that all the diamonds in the exhibit came from India, but that there are no longer active mines in that area of the world.

Bart discussed that a Fire and Ice Exceptional diamond is based on its optical purity and quality in the rough form, and that the Fire and Ice cut allows more light into the diamond and increases its value.

He discussed the fact the current cutting methods are a combination of Old World craftsmanship and New World technology. Lasers are not used to cut diamonds, but to measure facet sizes. The best diamonds are still cut by hand by a small segment of diamond cutting artisans.

Diamonds are sorted based on the color, quality, carat size and clarity, with the best stones being either white or colorless, and having the greatest amount of transparency. In a short video, Mr. Marks mentioned that 'sorters' actually use the shape of the rough stone to make their initial evaluation of its quality, value and whether it should then be 'cut.'. He stated that < 1% of the diamonds that Fire and Ice evaluate actually become ForeverMark diamonds.
